4.1 Council Meeting Sep 5, 2017

17-169 Mullett/Watton

Resolved to adopt minutes of the Sep 5, 2017 regular Council meeting as circulated.

7. Recreation/Tourism

7.1 Stadium Valve Replacement

17-170 Vatcher/Mullett

As the ammonia gas valve for the stadium compressor is causing problems and is no longer repairable, it is resolved to purchase a new valve from Young's Industrial Refrigeration at a cost of \$4,702.86 plus \$400.00 shipping and ~\$1000-\$1,500 labour.

7.2 Stadium Rates 2017/2018 Season

Resolved to increase stadium rates for the 2017/2018 season by 2-3% to the nearest round figure due to cost of living expenses.

- 9.1 Plan Amendment No. 17, Development Regulations Amendment No. 24

17-175 J. Snow/D. Snow

Under the authority of section 16, section 17 and section 18 of the *Urban and Rural Planning Act*, the Town of Lewisporte:

- a) Adopted the Lewisporte Municipal Plan Amendment No. 17, 2017 and Development Regulations Amendment No. 24, 2017 on August 1, 2017.
- b) Gave notice of the adoption of the Town of Lewisporte Municipal Plan Amendment No. 17, 2017 and Development Regulations Amendment No. 24, 2017 by advertisement inserted on August 16 and August 23, 2017 in *The Pilot* newspaper.
- c) Set 7:00 p.m. on September 6, 2017 at the Town Hall, Lewisporte for the holding of a public hearing to consider objections and submissions.

Now under section 23 of the *Urban and Rural Planning Act*, the Town Council of Lewisporte approves the Town of Lewisporte Municipal Plan Amendment No. 17, 2017 and the Town of Lewisporte Development Regulations Amendment No. 24, 2017 as adopted.

Municipal Plan Amendment No. 17, 2017, will re-designate land for a comprehensive subdivision development north of Bayview Heights and Second Avenue from Rural to Residential.

Development Regulations Amendment No. 24, 2017, will re-designate the same land along with additional land in the same general area from Rural (RUR) to Residential Medium Density (RMD) and Residential-Comprehensive Development Area (R-CDA) to Residential Medium Density (RMD).

10. Public Works - Meeting held Sep 18, 2017

10.1 Southside Excavating

During the course of Southside Excavating developing a subdivision (Old Briton Crescent), the Town agreed to cost share extending its water line to that development on a 50/50 basis, and also to include the additional cost of adding three homes in that area; therefore, it is resolved to pay the Town's total of \$75,000.00.

12.4 Network Assessment and Infrastructure Upgrade (Infotech Systems Proposal)

After comparative pricing, it is resolved to accept the proposal from Infotech Systems to upgrade the Town's existing IT infrastructure at an annual fee of \$2,894 (payable to Microsoft for software and antivirus upgrades, and server backup); \$7,800 to upgrade current hardware (server) and \$85/hr support fee.

12.6 LW Consulting Proposal / Boundary Expansion

Resolved to complete a CIP (Capital Investment Plant) to utilize gas tax funds to engage LW Consulting to prepare a feasibility study to extend Lewisporte's municipal boundary at a cost of \$5,750.00 plus travel expenses.

Amendment: Mullett/Tucker

Councillor J. Snow commented that Council has previously committed to using gas tax funds for a future alternate route through Town. Therefore it is resolved to amend motion 17-183 to exclude Gas Tax Funds and take from current budget.
